Birch Freeman High School. # Feb. 1961. Survelere, a Methodist Secondary School for Boys, opened in full session for the first time this morning, on the premises of the Methodist Primary School, Obele. On January 30th and 31st the school had assembled to make preparations. Today, fifty-five out of sixty boys meent for a double stream first year class were present. The staff consisted of mesers J. O. Dipeolu B. A., M. a. ajasin Oneyemi Onaboli a part-time tracher of art, together with Mr D. S. O. Sovemela. a First Class Certificated Feacher, as acting principal. as given by the methodist Education Secretary mr Roland Hughes, M.A. at the first meeting of its working Committee (vide Minutes of Sept. 19.4, 1960) is as follows: -In 1958 the Federal Thinishy of Education disclosed its intention to brild a Secondary

School for Boys on an acquired site in Surnlese, and asked if the Methodist Church (Western nigeria District) would take the responsibility of its management. The offer was accepted. The site, about 4:5 acres then was inspected and government promised that 4.3 acres of swemp adjoining would be acquired and drained. The new addition had been made, bringing the arrange up to 8.8. The Federal Ministry of Education had started to erect buildings on the site with a view to opening the school in January 1961. The Synod Education Committee of Juneary 1960 had received the report with pleasure and appointed mr M. J. Ehrt B.Sc (Ma-principal of the nethodist Boys High School Lagor) as the bringel - designete. Mr Etak had since left for the Muited Stated of answer for further studies. Before Mr Ehrk's departure. formerer, both he and the Education Secretary muchally agreed. Hat a thorking Committee be set up and that the permesion of the Ministry of Sometion to sought

3 for Mr D.S. O. Frenchen to act as Principal in mr Ehrk's absence. Due to surforeseen and unevoidable circumstances the buildings intended for the school was not get needy, and so the school had to find accommodation on the Obele methodist School premises temporately. Ag. Principal. Mr Roland Hyphes, the methodist Education secretary, paid a short wisit to the school during the morning session. He discussed with me problems of organisation.
